Programme Components

Component 1

- Academic partnerships in higher education, research and management to strengthen the institutional capacities of academic partner institutions in the South
- Preparatory funding to support researchers and institutions who do not yet have well established links and to plan and jointly write a project proposal

Component 2

 Master's and PhD grants in Austria for students and professionals from eligible countries

Budget: around 9 Million Euro (2010-2014)

- Institutional capacity building in higher education, research for development and management
- Sharing scientific, educational and institutional knowledge and experiences
- Improving the livelihood of marginalized social groups and/or peoples livelihood in general

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Thematic Focus

- higher education and research for development
- water supply and sanitation, rural development, energy, private sector development, governance and human rights
- poverty reduction, environment and natural resources, peace building and conflict prevention, gender equality
- strengthening of skills in social sciences as an instrument to systematically analyze the reasons of poverty and to empower capacities in social science research



Results of the Calls

- 17 academic partnerships with a total funding amount of ~4.9 million euros
- 24 preparatory funding grants for the joint elaboration of academic partnership proposals with a total funding amount of ~308,000 euros
- ~ 45 new Master's and PhD scholarships,
 67 students taken over from the North-South-Dialogue
 Scholarship Programme
- ~ 20 new grants specifically for scholarships within academic partnership projects

TRANSACT: Strengthening Rural Transformation Competences of Higher Education and Research Institutions in the Amhara Region, Ethiopia

The TRANSACT project is a joint initiative of two Ethiopian universities, one agricultural research organization, one Austrian funded rural development programme and one Austrian university. The main objective of the project is to strengthen the transformation competences of the Ethiopian consortium partners in research and training. Such transformation competences demand institutional capacities that translate into new partnerships and learning alliances allowing higher education and research to become more effective development partners and community service providers in North Gondar.

This is important, because in North Gondar there is untapped potential for social, economic and technical transformation that would gradually improve lives and livelihoods of farmers. These include technical improvements in agricultural and natural resource management, the realisation of new income opportunities, and thus the transformation from rural worlds with farmers living in poverty and social injustice to a rural society experiencing equality and prosperity. The realisation of this potential requires public and private actors to join forces with rural communities.

The TRANSACT project helps universities to respond more effectively to transformation opportunities among farmers in complex and risk-prone rural areas. A particular emphasis of this project is placed on learning and human behaviour as well as communication and collective action, especially in connection with society interactions that mediate change. This puts capabilities to coach farmers during transformation processes into the foreground. Hence, through this project much more effective linkages between research, higher education and extension will be realized.
